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Chapter 1 – Purpose

1:1 Designation The Student Union of the Faculty of Medicine shall be called "Consensus - The Faculty of Medicine and Health Sciences'

Student Union at Linköping University university".

1:2 Purpose referred to The Student Union at the Faculty of Medicine, hereinafter

as Consensus, is a voluntary non-profit association of individuals with a connection to the Faculty of Medicine.

Consensus

primary purpose is to promote the study and what thus has context. In addition, Consensus will promote all students' studies.



Chapter 2 - Membership

- 2:1 Membership As a registered student at the Faculty of Medicine at Linköping University has the right to become a full-fledged student member. This membership also means membership of the section that is linked to the degree programme. As not registered student at the Faculty of Medicine and Health Sciences, there is the opportunity to to a supporting membership (see 2:4).
- 2:2 Member Obligations The membership fee can be paid per semester, year or other period determined by the council. Membership fees are determined by the council.
- 2:3 Member rights Each member has the right to attend the council's meeting. A member, except a supporting member, has the right to: participate in the election of council members. Each member is eligible positions of trust within Consensus, with the exceptions provided for in the is set out in this statute. Members have the right to receive interpellation or motion considered by the council.
- Consensus and concern Each member has the right to take part in the minutes of the other documents, which are not covered by confidentiality, or Consensus' work with external counterparties, in progress negotiation or dispute.

- 2:4 Support membership As a non-registered student at the Faculty of Medicine at Linköping University has a natural or legal person with connection to the Faculty of Medicine and Health and Medicine Consensus. This membership can if desired mean support membership in one of the Consensus sections. People who are not studying at the Faculty of Medicine at Linköping



University

university, but at another faculty or in the area of Educational Sciences at Linköping University, can only be support member of Consensus if he/she is a member of

Chapter 3 - Honorary Member

- 3:1 Honorary Consensus may appoint a person as an honorary member who:

Chapter 4 - Organisation and year of operation

Consensus' organisation and activities are conducted with Swedish as a working language.

4:1 Organization The activities of the Corps are carried out in the following manner through:

1. Council
2. Nominating committee
3. Student Union Board
4. Administrator
5. Committee
6. Working groups
7. Sections/constituencies
8. Consensus auditors

Items 1–4 above constitute the central organisation of Consensus.

4:2 Governing documents Consensus has seven governing documents that govern its activities

and opinions. These are:

1. Statutes
2. Opinion program
3. Policy documents
4. Rules of Procedure
5. Vision document
6. Budget
7. Operational plan

Consensus policy documents are ranked in descending order according to the list under item 4:2 where statutes are given the highest priority, and Operational plan is given the lowest priority.

4:3 Year Consensus' financial year lasts from July 1st to June 30th next calendar year.





Chapter 5 - Consensus Council and Elections

- 5:1 Powers The General Council is Consensus' highest decision-making body.
- 5:2 Composition The council consists of 29 members. The members of the council are: elected by their constituency but shall work in the best interests of the Consensus.
- 5:3 Mandate The council's term of office lasts from July 1st to June 30th next calendar year. Mandate as in a Council meeting is not filled is not counted in the the council's total number of seats. By-elections are made by Council members are the responsibility of the responsible section chairman to report this to the council presidium, and Union President no later than seven days before the next council meeting. This mandate will then count as appointed.
- 5:4 Management of Council. Council meetings are chaired by the Chairman of the Council.
- Council-meeting In the absence of the Chairman of the Council, the meeting is chaired by: Vice meeting Chairman of the Council. In the event of simultaneous absence of the chairman and the vice-council chairman, it is the responsibility of the union board's presidium to propose a temporary chairman.
- 5:5 Notice of Council-fixed meeting Preliminary The Council meets at the invitation of Chairman of the Council. The date and time of the meeting are by the council presidium in consultation with the union board. The agenda is drawn up by the Chairman of the Council. Notice of the Annual General Council meeting, and preliminary the agenda shall be sent to the members of the council, Consensus board, section chair, auditors and the Chairman of the Nomination Committee at least three weeks before Meeting. At the same time, the notice must be served with Consensus members on the Consensus website. Final draft agenda with basis for decision, bills, motions including the board's response to the motion,

1. Establish an operational plan for the coming financial year.
 2. Determine the membership fee and budget for the coming financial year and determine any fees for Consensus centrally engaged.

A member of the council, or a personal deputy in office, has the right to attend, speak, propose and vote at the Meetings. A student union member has the right to attend and speak.
In addition, deputy council members, auditors, deputy auditors and the union board have the right to speak and make proposals.
The Chairman of the Council and the Deputy Chairman of the Council have the right to express opinions and proposals on matters of substance and order.
Other administrators elected by the council have the right to express and make proposals on matters relating to their assignment.
Section chairs have the right to speak and make proposals. Present motions have the right to speak and make proposals at consideration of the motion.

Chapter 6 - Nomination Committee

- 6:1 Eligibility Only those who are eligible to participate in the elections within their respective constituencies, but not member of the union board or other elected representative within the Consensus' central organisation for the intended financial year.
- only A member of the student union board entitled to vote may paying member of Consensus is elected. In addition, elect non-members to all assignments except representatives entitled to vote in external bodies.
- 6:2 Nominating committee The Nomination Committee is appointed by the General Council at Consensus autumn election meeting. By-elections can be made if necessary. Each section has the right to at least one representative on the Nomination Committee.
- of the A member of the Nomination Committee may not run for any assignments for which the Nomination Committee has to propose candidates.
- 6:3 Mandate The Nomination Committee is elected for one year, from December 1st to December 30th November.
- 6:4 Duties It is the responsibility of the Nomination Committee:
- that** actively seek candidates for the positions that the council is to choose.
 - to** draw up proposals for candidates for the positions to be chosen by the council.
 - that** distribute the council seats between Consensus and Constituencies.
 - that** If there is disagreement in the Nomination Committee regarding a particular proposal, This is notified to the council. The proposal must be submitted in sufficient time to it can be sent at least seven days before the Council meeting.



- 6:5 The Nomination Committee's meeting The Nomination Committee meets at the invitation of the Nomination Committee's chairman.
- 6:6 Distribution of Council mandate The distribution of council seats is done as follows:
1. Each constituency has two basic mandates.
 2. The remaining seats are distributed among the constituencies until the council consists of 29 members.
 3. The distribution of seats in the Consensus Council is carried out by the Nomination Committee at a special Nomination Committee meeting no later than March 31st.
 4. Minutes of the distribution of seats shall be prepared and signed by the members of the nomination committee and copies shall be sent to all section boards and the union board together with the calculation.
- 6:7 Distribution of other seats mandate It is the responsibility of the Chairman of the Nomination Committee to training to obtain these numbers.

Chapter 7 - Student Union Board

- 7:1 Powers The union board represents Consensus between Council meetings and procedures, in accordance with the with Consensus steering documents and made by the council decisions, the immediate management of Consensus' activities.
- 7:2 Composition The Union Board consists of a maximum of nine (9) members, of which Two (2) are signatories, chairman and vice chairman. Four (4) members have specific responsibilities: education, work environment, student welfare issues and chairman of meetings. Beyond These are the Board of Directors of up to three (3) other members.
- 7:3 Meetings The Union Board meets at the invitation of the Board meeting chair. Right to request the announcement of The union board meeting is for each board member.
- 7:4 Summons Notice, agenda and all attendees documents must be provided to everyone with the right to attend at least three days before the meeting.
- Documents received by all those entitled to attend within three days of the meeting shall be added to the agenda of the meeting.
- 7:5 Attendance, expression, the Board of Directors The right to attend, speak, propose and vote belongs to Right to propose and vote members. If the Board of Directors does not decide otherwise in a particular matter The following applies:
- The right to attend, speak and propose is added to Consensus administrators, auditors, the Nomination Committee's chairman and section chair.
- The right to attend, speak and propose is granted by the council or the union board elected an official in a matter concerning his/her area of activity.
- Individual union members who have raised a question with the

7:7 Decision on emergency matter

Can be done in two ways:

1. Per capsulam (decision without a meeting in the usual way):
When the union board cannot meet for urgent matters, the members of the union board must agree on the way to decide, i.e. that decisions are made per capsulam. At the next meeting, which takes place in the usual way, the quorum of the decision is reported.
It must be clear from the minutes that decisions have been made per capsulam.
2. The Consensus Presidium, which consists of the Union President and Vice Union President, has the right to jointly make decisions in urgent matters when the Union Board cannot meet or make decisions per capsulam. Decisions must be reported at the next following union board meeting.

Chapter 8 - Administrators

- 8:1 Powers Consensus administrators prepare within their area of activity issues to be dealt with by the Union Board and the implementation of the

- The union board and the council made a decision. Within its area of activity, the administrators have the right to conduct activities, as they do not conflict with governing documents or decision made by the union board or council.
- 8:2 Administrator implement Consensus administrators are elected representatives to Consensus' operational activities. All Administrators are paid part-time.
- The administrator's assignment is regulated by Consensus' rules of procedure and job descriptions. In special cases, the union board can provisionally appoint new administrators and define the area of activity until the next ordinary council meeting, when the administrator's activities must be reviewed and possibly written into the governing documents.
- The International Manager is employed and remunerated by the Faculty of Medicine.

Chapter 13 – Amendment of the statutes

13:1 Amendment to the statutes Amendments to the statutes are presented in the form of a motion or

The amendment shall be considered at a council meeting. A decision requires at least two majority of the number of seats filled.

13:2 Amendment of a decision is made

A change in the purpose of the Consensus requires that by a five-sixths majority of the number of appointed members; at least 15 members, at two council meetings at two different terms of office.

13:3 Resolutions on Amendment of the statutes for Special sections
Special sections
Special sections include all sections under Chapters:

1. Amendment to the statutes
2. Corps dissolution and union merger
3. Annulment of decisions
4. Interpretation of the statutes

Amendments to the statutes require identical resolutions with at least three a quarter majority at two council meetings with at least one every month.

In urgent cases, the bylaws can be amended with immediate if the council unanimously approves the wording proposed in the bill, motion or statement of the Board of

Directors

over the motion, provided that the adopted proposal has been council members at least seven days before the meeting.

Chapter 14 - Dissolution and Merger of Corps

14:1 Resolutions on Corps dissolution

The resolution of the Consensus is as follows:

1. The union board puts a bill on this in the union council, which postpones the issue and refers the issue to the sections. The sections call for an extraordinary election meeting in all constituencies.
2. All election meetings must adopt the bill with a majority of at least five-sixths.
3. If this happens, the union board will call an extraordinary council meeting and reopen the bill. The Student Union Council must adopt the bill with at least a five-sixths majority of the number of statutory members in order for Consensus to be considered dissolved.
4. Decisions on the distribution of cash and assets according to the payment of outstanding debts are made by the Student Union Council. However, the assets cannot be used for anything that is contrary to the purpose and intentions of Consensus.

14:2 Decision on the organization that merger

Mergers with another union or organization will be carried out following:

1. The union board puts a bill on this in the council, which postpones the issue and refers the issue to the sections. The sections call for an extraordinary election meeting in all constituencies.
2. All election meetings must adopt the bill with a majority of at least five-sixths.
3. If this happens, the union board will call an extraordinary council meeting and reopen the bill. The Student Union Council must adopt the bill with at least a five-sixths majority of the number of statutory members in order for the merger to take place.





Chapter 15 – Interpretation of the Statutes

15:1 Interpretation In the event of a dispute about the interpretation of these statutes, the council has the right to refer the matter to the Dean of the Faculty of Medicine. By Its dean has decided the question concerns the union board's interpretation.
